The University has adopted a multiple-media approach for imparting instruction to its learners for its various programmes of study. The University follows the Systems approach to instructional design. The programme was designed after undertaking need analysis; identifying and defining the target group; selection of appropriate media; course design and development; pilot testing and launch of the programme; and periodic revision. The self instructional format is used for developing Self Learning Material (SLM) in print and multiple media. Print is the predominant mode of instruction supplemented with audio and video

programmes; face to face counselling sessions; interactive radio counselling; educational TV broadcasts. For practical based courses practical sessions are conducted in face to face mode (which is compulsory component).
